The collected data is more than a statistical summary; it's a vibrant mosaic of voices that will influence our future programming and initiatives. Grasping this data is pivotal, empowering us to be more adaptive, strategic, and impactful in our philanthropic endeavors.

Continuing to tap into the joy and transformative power of collaborative giving, our dynamic giving circles and giving groups inspired and led by AJF have allowed us to expand our reach, fostering a sense of community and shared purpose. The ability to come together and pool resources for a greater impact is at the heart of what we do.

Our partnership with Catchafire entered its second year, with a strengthened focus on building the capacity of the for-purpose sector, reaffirming our commitment to fostering innovative collaborations, leading to profound change in how our organisations work.

A highlight of 2022 was bringing a third cohort of 34 leaders into the LaunchPad Leadership network and the gift of hosting a retreat to finally come together. This 3-day retreat, our first in-person gathering since May 2019, was a landmark event for us. It gave 70 leaders from across all 3 cohorts the opportunity to engage in collective thinking about the future of the Jewish community in Australia. The exchange of ideas, shared vision, and the sense of unity reinforced the importance of every individual and their role in our collective mission. The impact of this retreat will resonate in our future initiatives and the continued growth of our leadership community.

Our Board of Directors, particularly guided by the steadfast leadership of Simone Szalmuk-Singer and Justin Greenstein as Co-Chairs in the first half of 2022, warrants special appreciation. Together with the entire board, their combined dedication, wisdom, and investment of time, talent, treasure, ties, and testimonies have been instrumental in AJF's success. Each director has contributed significantly, and we extend our deepest gratitude for their tireless efforts.

Solitel group (Sydney).

IsraAID, Israel's leading non-governmental humanitarian aid agency serves as an exemplary ambassador for Israel around the world. Since its founding in 2001, IsraAID has provided emergency relief services and implemented sustainable development programs in more than 50 countries.

Yotam leads a team of over 250 people. They are currently active in 15 countries, including a large-scale operation in Ukraine. Yotam shared his experiences from helping evacuate Afghanistan women as the Taliban took over to saving a young boy's life 3 days after the Nepalese earthquake.

The brain child of community activist and leader **Darren Smorgon**, NextThink's mission is to improve the quality of giving, encourage Jewish innovation and maximise impact.

AJF, together with steering committee members **Jonathan Gavshon**, **Amanda Goodman** and **Rodney Rosmarin** facilitate thoughtfully curated experiences, supporting and guiding the 22 couples to imagine and realise their philanthropic aspirations, at the individual and collective levels.

Participants had the incredible opportunity to hear from powerful and influential philanthropic leaders **Daniel Petre AO** and **David Gonski AC**, who both challenged thinking and encouraged each of them to step up as leaders of change.

In only two short months, a community has been built, a donor collaborative of 4 families formed who pooled resources to fund 3 high profile leaders from the wider community; Ian Thorpe AM, Nick McKenzie and Dr Kate Hadwen participate in the 2023 March Of The Living Australia Program to witness first hand the atrocities of the Holocaust and the energy of Israel celebrating 75 years.



2. All Things Equal & Jewish Care VIC

The Grant was provided to support the development of a strategic partnership between All Things Equal and Jewish Care to activate an under utilised cafe space within the Camit & Nathan Cher Family Cafe in the Hannah & Daryl Cohen Family Building at the Holckner Senior Living & Community Precinct in Windsor.

The cafe (on-going) engages people living with a disability and/or those who participate in an employment program to gain genuine pathway opportunities for employment, training and skills development in a supportive and caring environment.

LaunchPad Leadership

After two successful cohorts of LaunchPad Leadership in 2020 and 2021, it was a privilege for AJF to facilitate a third cohort investing in a further 34 leaders. This inspiring virtual program promotes and builds a culture of leadership development to ensure a vibrant and thriving Jewish community.

LaunchPad Leadership's mission is to empower lay, philanthropic and professional leaders of Jewish for-purpose organisations with the necessary skills and resources to lead with impact during uncertain times. The blending of Jewish values with technical skills and leadership theory is paramount to nurturing and developing empowered and enabled leaders.

Participants come from across Australia and showcase the diversity of the Australian Jewish for-purpose sector, through gender, age, experience, religious beliefs, as well as an opportunity for lay, philanthropic and professional leaders to learn and grow together.







"I was privileged to attend the LaunchPad Leadership Alumni Retreat in Bowral, NSW. LaunchPad is a project of the Australian Jewish Funders where they bring together Jewish leaders from around Australia to empower them and encourage collaboration.

Arriving on Sunday morning, I really didn't know what to expect. I was part of the 2022 cohort who had participated in weekly workshops and leadership training, but it was all online. I hadn't met many of them in person or spoken to them individually.

My fears were exacerbated knowing that I was a Rabbi attending a retreat with attendees from different segments of the community. I was worried how I would be welcomed and how I would relate to those I'd meet. Would we see eye to eye and find common ground?

I decided that I would focus on improving my leadership skills and take advantage of the world-class presenters who would talk about topics such as self-care, communication, design thinking and building communities. If I connected to some of the other attendees, that would be a bonus.

Boy was I wrong. I felt welcomed by everyone in a non-judgemental way. The workshops were great and I really benefited, however, it was from these incredible leaders I met that I benefited from the most. Their passion and commitment to improving Jewish life is contagious. Over conversations in small group exercises, during the limited downtime or over meals, each person was willing to share their experience and offer advice to personal and communal challenges.

There were so many highlights over the 3 days, one of many that stands out was meeting the Ukrainian Ambassador to Australia, His Excellency Mr Vasyl Myroshnychenko. Vasyl talked about becoming the ambassador during the war and leading the effort to bring military and humanitarian aid from Australia.

To sum up my experience, I arrived with fears and challenges and I left with hope, inspiration and strategies. I feel honoured to be part of such a diverse group of Jewish leaders that have the courage to change the status quo and ask the difficult questions.

We might all come from different backgrounds and have a different point of view or focus in the community, but we all share a common goal. I have a deeper respect and understanding for these leaders and I know that I can count on them for support, just as they can count on me.
